# Mt. Airy Wyldlife

"Young Life" is the name of our organization, and it's also what we call our outreach to high school-aged kids. We have named our middle school and junior high ministry"Wyldlife" to differentiate between the two age groups and their varying developmental stages and maturity levels. Both ministries stay true to the time-tested practices we've been using for more than 60 years: going where kids are, loving them

unconditionally, earning the right to be heard and communicating God's love in terms kids can understand.

The Mt. Airy Wyldlife ministry is a partnership between Young Life Frederick County and Young Life Carroll County focused on reaching middle school kids in the Mt. Airy area (this includes kids from Mt. Airy Middle, New Market Middle, Windsor Knolls Middle, private, and home schools). Wyldlife meets twice monthly at the Mt. Airy Library and drew over 50 kids to the first club this year. God has heard and answered our prayers for more leaders. Joining our team this year are Christy Erickson, Cindy and Tom Webb, Kim Nichols, Frank Szita, and Nancy Rodgers. This compliments our current leadership of Lisa Bale, Donna Shurney, Míke Rodgers, Terry Marcoux, Gordon Míltenberger, Greg Stevens, Terry Sípes, and Patrick Shurney. Within the next year we expect to be able to build enough prayer support, leadership and momentum to separate the Wyldlife clubs in Mt. Airy into two, with one being focused on the Windsor Knolls/New Market area and the other at Mt. Airy Middle.
